Throughout each semester, you were most likely to find him in his classroom, of course, preparing for lectures and labs, or the conference room downstairs, setting up anatomical models and helping his students learn.

Joel loves music and took opportunities to share that with the campus and community by playing violin and/or singing for the PC orchestra's production of the Messiah many times, CHAP concerts, and other events. He was once part of a barbershop quartet with other PC faculty.

Off campus, he has been heavily involved in his church, getting away for lunch with his wife of 41 years, Colene on "wife Wednesdays," participating in the family tradition of smashing gingerbread houses at Christmas, and venturing off to San Diego to see his grandkids.

He's been a mentor to many in the natural science division, sharing his love of teaching and learning. He makes time for anyone, student or colleague. He is passionate about serving his students, following Jesus, and sharing his unmatched enthusiasm for anatomy. His most important contribution to the college was delivering high energy lectures and labs using all manners of pedagogical techniques to involve the cognitive, affective, and psychomotor domains of his students. He leaves a long-lasting legacy on the campus and community; PC won't be the same without him. He is beloved by his students and after nearly 30 years of teaching, one might say you can't swing a dead cat without hitting one of those former students.
