Findings	EMSI data indicates that police and sheriff's patrol officers positions are projected to grow within the four-county region (Kern, Inyo, Tulare, Mono) by 1.6% 2014-2018. Police and Sheriff patrol officer's positions specifically expect a five-year projected growth of 1.6% regionally, 4.5% state wide and 2.1% nationally. The average hourly earnings for police and sheriff's patrol officers are \$34.13 regionally. The average hourly earnings nationally is \$ 28.69.
